



THREE QUESTIONS FOR LATTER-DAY SAINTS ON ETERNAL LIFE

Jesus Christ told us that the Bible is true, “Thy word is truth” (John 17:17). With this statement, He set the standard by which all other things must be compared, because it is the measure for truth. When we compare Mormon doctrine to the Bible, then we find several contradictions. Consider these three vitally important questions that can affect your eternal life. If you are wrong about God, Jesus, and salvation, then you are wrong enough to lose your soul for all eternity.



Was God the Father once a man or is He eternally God as Spirit?

LDS SCRIPTURE STATES THAT GOD WAS A MAN:

“The Father has a body of flesh and bones as tangible as man’s; the Son also; but the Holy Ghost has not a body of flesh and bones, but is a personage of spirit” (*Doctrine and Covenants* [D & C] 130:22). See also *Moses* 6:8-9 and 7:35.

THE BIBLE STATES THAT GOD IS NOT A MAN: In the Bible we find explicit statements that God is Spirit and that God the Father was NOT a man. “I am God, and not man, the Holy One in your midst” (Hosea 11:9; see also Numbers 23:19). The Bible teaches that “God is Spirit” (John 4:24). In 2 Corinthians 3:17, it states that “the Lord is the Spirit.”

God is not composed of parts, like a man. He is Spirit, which is quite different from saying He “has” a spirit. God is present everywhere as Spirit and cannot be confined, “the heavens and the heaven of heavens cannot contain You” (1 Kings 8:27). And, “Do I not fill heaven and earth? Says the LORD” (Jeremiah 23:24). God is not man, as He said, He is Spirit, and he is omnipresent, not limited by time and space.



Does God exist as One Being (monotheism) or as many gods (polytheism)?

LDS SCRIPTURE STATES THAT THERE ARE MANY GODS, WHICH IS POLYTHEISM:

“The Gods, organized and formed the heavens and the earth . . . (*Book of Abraham* 4:1). These “gods” are seen 48 additional times in *Abraham* 4 and 5, which is polytheism. The D & C adds to this, “Then shall they be gods, because they have no end . . .” (132:20). And, “Abraham . . . Isaac also and Jacob . . . have entered into their exaltation . . . and are not angels, but are gods” (132:37). These Mormon scriptures express clear polytheism.



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
