# What Do Mormons Believe About GOD ?

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# A COMPARATIVE STUDY

THE PURPOSE OF THIS SHORT STUDY IS TO EXAMINE, AS FAIRLY AS POSSIBLE, WHAT THE MORMONS BELIEVE ABOUT GOD COMPARED WITH WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS ABOUT GOD. WE HAVE TRIED TO PRESENT THE MORMON POINT OF VIEW AS ACCUR-ATELY AS POSSIBLE, WHICH IS RATHER DIFFICULT IN SOME AREAS DUE TO WHAT APPEAR TO BE CONTRADICTORY CONCEPTS, BOTH SIDES OF WHICH COME FROM ACCEPTABLE AND OFFICIAL SOURCES WITHIN MORMONISM.

THE PRIMARY INTENT OF THIS MATERIAL IS NOT TO ATTACK MORMONISM, BUT TO PRESENT A COMPARATIVE STUDY ON TWO OPPOSING CONCEPTS OF GOD. ANY INAC-CURACY OR WHAT MAY APPEAR TO BE SARCASM OR RIDICULE IS UNINTENTIONAL. OUR GOAL IS TO PRESENT BOTH POSITIONS AS CLEARLY AS POSSIBLE AND ALLOW THE SEEKER TO SELECT THAT WHICH HE BELIEVES TO BE TRUE. HOWEVER, WE MAKE NO PRETENSE OF BEING UNBIASED, ONLY A DESIRE TO BE FAIR AND ACCU-RATE BOTH WITH MORMONISM AND THE WORD OF GOD, THE BIBLE.

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IT'S DEVICUS THAT MORMONS BELIEVE IN MANY, MANY GODS. LET'S BACK IP AND GET A BROADER PICTURE OF THIS WHOLE POLYTHEISTIC CONCEPT.

ACCORDING TO MORMON THEOLOGY; Previous to the creation of our present earth the GODS in heaven were called into council by the "head god." (NOTE: Each GOD had worked his way through humanness or mortality in another physical/material world to the position of deity) Adam. one of these gods. and one of his wives. Eve. were assigned to head up this new world, to become mortal again, to "fall," and to provide physical bodies, through sexual reproduction, to house the many spirit children they and the other gods had produced in heaven.

Francis M. Darter, a High Priest in the Mormon Church in his book, CELESTIAL MARRIAGE, pages 17 & 18 says,

"(Adam & Eve) ages before, they lived and died as all mortals and were saved in a Celestial glory. There, in the course of an age, they became the father and mother of countless spiritual children. These spiritual children no doubt also included those from other wives of Adam and from his sons and grandsons saved in the same degree of Celestial glory with Adam. The Gods met, and Adam was set apart to be the God of a new world soon to be created "

"In the Book of Mormon we read. 'Adam fell that men might be; and men are, that they might have joy;' that is, we must pass through mortality before we can enjoy a Celestial glory. They, Adam and Eve, were immortal beings, but says Eliza R. Snow (wife of Joseph Smith), 'They ate of the trees of mortal life and partook of the elements of this earth that they might again become mortal for their children's sake. They fell that another world might have a probation, redemption and resurrection." (WOMEN OF MORMANISM, by Eliza R. Snow)

The goal of every good Mormon male is to work his way up to deity in the hope that someday, like Adam, he too might have a planet like earth to rule.

DO NORMONS BELIEVE IN MORE THAN ONE GOD???? (CONTINUED)

NOTE: IT'S VERY IMPORTANT THAT A CHRISTIAN STUDYING MURMONISM REALIZE THAT THEIR POLYTHEISTIC DOCTRINES ARE NOT OPENLY EXPRESSED TO THE NON-MORMON WORLD AND THAT WORKONS WILL TRY TO CONCEAL THESE BELIEFS UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THEY FEEL ANY PERSON BEING PROSELYTED IS WELL WITHIN THEIR INFLUENCE.

ALSO NOTE HOW IN THE FOLLOWING REFERENCES THEIR OWN BOOK OF MORINON APPEARS TO SAY THE SAME AS THE BIBLE IN REGARD TO MONOTHEISM (THE BELIEF IN ONLY ONE GOD). YOU MAY, ON OCCASION, BE ABLE TO USE THESE MONOTHEISTIC VERSES IN DEMONSTRATING TO A MORMON THE APPARENT CONTRADICTIONS WITHIN HIS VERY OWN SACRED WRITINGS AND THE DOCTRINES OF HIS CHURCH AS WELL AS SHOWING HIM THE BASIS FOR BELIEVING IN ONLY ONE GOD.

#### IS THERE NORE THAN ONE GOD?

#### ACCORDING TO MORMONISM, WHO IS JESUS CHRIST ???

As we look at MORMON CHRISTOLOGY (THE STUDY & CONCEPT OF CHRIST) WE WILL FIND CONSIDERABLE CONFUSION AS TO HIS NATURE AND HIS ORIGIN. I.E.

NOTE: Talmage falls into the error of making Elohim (Mighty One) and Jehovah (YHWH - "| am that ! am" - Ex.3:13,14) two separate gods, apparently in complete ignorance of the fact that the two are compounded in the Hebrew as YHWH the MIGHTY ONE (LORD God) as any concordance of Hebrew usage in the Old Testament readily reveals. (See Gen.24:7; 28:13; Ex.3:15,18; 4:5; 5:1; 7:5; ...)

IT SHOULD ALSO BE OF INTEREST TO LEARN THAT LUCIFER (SATAN), WHO WAS A SPIRIT BROTHER OF JESUS PRIOR TO HIS INCARNATION. FELL FROM HEAVEN BE-CAUSE OF HIS JEALOUSY OF CHRIST. CHRIST WAS APPOINTED BY THE GODS TO BECOME THE REDEEMER OF THE RACE THAT WOULD FALL AS A RESULT OF ADAM'S INTENTIONAL SIN. ("They ate of of the trees of mortal life, and partook of the elements of this earth that they might again become mortal for their children's sake. They fell that another world might have a probation, redemption and resurrection." WOMEN OF MORMONISM by Eliza R. Snow, wife of Joseph Smith). IT WAS TO CHRIST'S APPOINTED OFFICE OF REDEEMER TO WHICH LUCIFER ASPIRED, THUS HIS ANTIPATHY. LUCIFER IS EVEN OUDTED AS SAYING: "Behold, here am I, send me. I will be thy son, and I will redeem all mankind, that one soul shall not be lost and surely I will do it; wherefore give me thy honor." (Chapter 4 of the BOOK OF MOSES, found in THE PEARL OF GREAT PRICE, catalogs all of these events, including the fall of Satan and the establishment of the Garden of Eden (chapter 6) which you will be surprised to learn was really located in Missouri and not in the area of the Tigris and Euphrates rivers)

IN MORMON THEOLOGY, CHRIST AS A PRE-EXISTENT SPIRIT WAS NOT ONLY THE BROTHER OF THE DEVIL BUT CELEBRATED HIS OWN MARRIAGE TO "...both Marys and to Martha, whereby he could see his seed before he was crucified." (Apostle Orson Hide, See J. W. Gunnison, THE MORMONS, page 68, and J. H. Snowden, <u>THE TRUTH ABOUT</u> <u>MORMONISM</u>, 1926, page 130) THE BIBLE STATES VERY SUCCINCTLY THAT CHRIST WAS CONCEIVED IN THE VIRGIN MARY BY THE HOLY SPIRIT. (Matthew 1:18-20; Luke 1:35), YET NOTICE BRIGHAM YOUNG'S CONTRADICTORY STATEMENT: "When the virgin Mary conceived the child Jesus, the father had begotten him in his own likeness. He was not begotten by the Holy Ghost. And who was the father? He was the first of the human family ... Jesus our elder brother was begotten in the flesh by the same character that was in the Garden of Eden and who is our father in heaven (Adam)." (JOURNAL OF DISCOURSES, VOL. I, pages 50 and 51)

AS WE WILL FIND IN THE FOLLOWING; BOTH THE BOOK OF MORMON AND THE BIBLE STATE THAT JESUS IS JEHOVAH GOD COME IN THE FLESH TO DIE FOR MAN'S SINS. HOWEVER, THAT APPARENT AGREEMENT IS ONLY THE INTERSECTION OF TWO CONCEPTS COMING FROM TWO ENTIRELY DIFFERENT DIRECTIONS AND THUS DO NOT REALLY MEAN THE SAME THING.

### What Do Mormons Believe About God?

ACCORDING TO MORMONISM, WHAT IS THE NATURE AND FUNCTION OF THE HOLY SPIRIT?

THE BIBLE IDENTIFIES THE HOLY SPIRIT (HOLY GHOST TO THE MORMONS) AS THE THIRD PERSON OF THE GODHEAD. HE IS CO-EQUAL WITH THE FATHER AND WITH THE SON. HE IS THE PERSON OF GOD WHD INDWELLS THE BELIEVER (John  $14:17; 1 \text{ cor.} 6:19,20; \ldots$ ) IN ORDER TO CONVICT (John  $16:8-11; \ldots$ ), INSTRUCT (John  $14:26; \ldots$ ), COMFORT (Romans  $8:26,27; \ldots$ ), INTERPRET AND DISCERN GOD'S DIVINE WILL ( $1 \text{ cor.} 2:10-14; \ldots$ ) HE SEEKS CONSTANT-LY TO WORK THROUGH BELIEVERS TO TOUCH OTHER BELIEVERS AND NON-BELIEVERS WITH DIVINE TRUTH, CONVICTION AND THE KNOWLEDGE OF CHRIST. HE IS THE AUTHOR AND SOURCE OF ANY AND ALL DIVINE GOOD MANIFESTED THROUGH THE BE-LIEVER ( $Gal.5:22,23; \ldots$ ) AND ALSO HE IS THE ONLY PERSON WHO CAN LEAD ANYONE TO CHRIST (THE BELIEVER IS SIMPLY TO BE AN AVAILABLE CHANNEL).

NOW LET'S LOOK AT HOW THE MORMONS VIEW THE HOLY GHOST OR HOLY SPIRIT:

"The term Holy Ghost and its common synonyms, Spirit of God, Spirit of the lord, or simply Spirit, Comforter, and Spirit of Truth occur in the Scriptures with plainly different meanings, referring in some cases to the person of God the Holy Ghost, and in other instances to the power and authority of this great personage, or to the agency through which He ministers ... The Holy Ghost undoubtedly possesses personal powers and affections; these attributes exist in Him in perfection. Thus He teaches and guides, testifies of the Father and the Son, reproves, rebukes, speaks, commands, commissions ... These are not figurative expressions but plain statements of the attributes and characteristics of the Holy Ghost."

from <u>THE ARTICLES OF FAITH</u> by James E. Talmage - p.115

IF WE STOPPED HERE THERE WOULD BE LITTLE IF ANY WITH WHICH WE COULD ARGUE, HOWEVER, IF WE PRESS ON INTO THE MORMON CONCEPT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (GHOST) WE FIND CONSIDERABLE CONFUSION AND SOME CONTRADICTION.

"Jesus Christ ... was filled with the divine substance or fluid called the Holy Spirit, by which He comprehended and spake the truth in power and authority, and by which He controlled the elements and imparted health and life to those who were prepared to partake of the same ... The purest, most refined and subtle of all these substances and the one least understood or even recognized by the less informed among mankind is that substance called the Holy Spirit." \*

\* Some Mormons quoting early Mormon writers have attempted to differentiate between the Holy Spirit and the Holy Ghost. This, however, is <u>linguistically impossible</u> in New Testament Greek as any lexicon will reveal.

PARLEY P. PRATT CAN CERTAINLY BE CONSIDERED AN OFFICIAL SOURCE OF MORMON THEOLOGY AND A MAN WHOSE WRITINGS ARE STILL CIRCULATED TODAY BY HIS CHURCH AS AUTHORITATIVE AND REPRESENTATIVE. YET PARLEY P. PRATT PRESENTS THE HOLY SPIRIT (GHOST) AS A CONFUSING MIXTURE OF SUBSTANCE, FLUID AND A PERSON.

The Bible, however, consistently portrays God the Holy Spirit, Third person of the Trinity, as an eternal, omnipotent, omniscient and omnipresent Being, sharing all the attributes of deity and one with the Father and the Son.

MORMONS ARE, TO SAY THE LEAST, CONFUSED AND DIVIDED ON THE NATURE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (GHOST). ALSO, AS WE PREVIOUSLY DISCOVERED, MORMONISM HAS RE-PLACED THE HOLY SPIRIT'S PART IN MARY'S PREGNANCY WITH JESUS (Matt.1:18-20; Luke 1:35) AND PROCLAIMED ADAM AS THE "FATHER" INSTEAD.

AS A FINAL PHASE IN THIS SHORT STUDY OF MORMONISM LET US LOOK AT THEIR CON-CEPT OF SALVATION AS COMPARED WITH THE BIBLICAL CONCEPT OF SALVATION.

## What Do Mormons Believe About God?

ACCORDING TO MORMONISM, WHAT MUST A PERSON DO TO BE SAVED ???? IS JESUS CHRIST THE COMPLETE AND ONLY WAY???

LET US FIRST EXAMINE THE MORMON POSITION ON CHRIST AND SALVATION AND THEN COMPARE IT WITH THE BIBLICAL POSITION ON CHRIST AND SALVATION:
